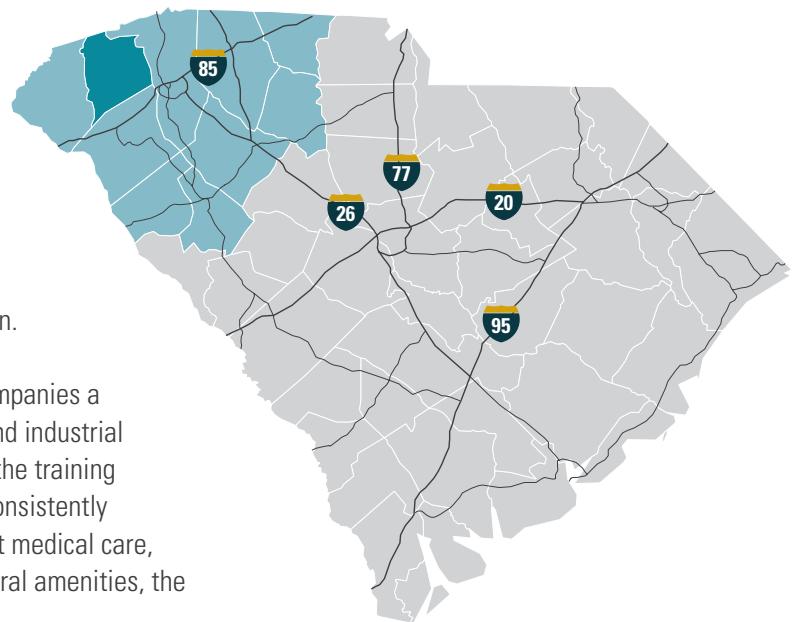


Pickens COUNTY

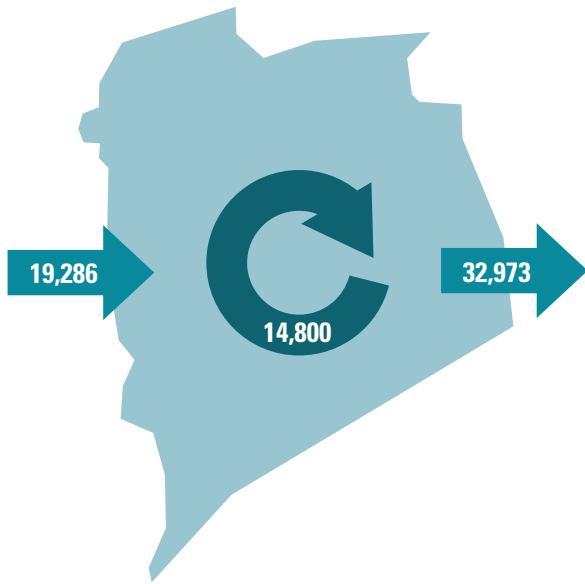
